

Dear EGEE-II project members,

Though the first month of 2008 is already coming to a close, I wish you all a very happy, productive and successful new year!

For the project, 2008 has started well with the completion of negotiations for EGEE-III as planned on 17 January. The Project Office worked with all partners and activities to finalise both the Grant Preparation Forms and Description of Work for the project. In parallel, the European Commission is currently processing the participant data provided and we will soon proceed with signature of the forms to start the formal Grant Agreement preparation process.

Regarding EGEE-II, the one month extension has been applied for in a formal contract amendment and we expect its imminent approval. This will delay the end of the project to 30 April 2008, after which an EGEE-II/EGEE-III transition meeting will be organised at CERN on 6 and 7 May. This meeting will give us the opportunity to welcome new and old partners and to present the administrative, financial and procedural context of the project as well as its technical programme of work. Details of this meeting will be communicated in future editions of this letter.

All Activity Meeting

The All Activity Meeting was held in Sofia, Bulgaria, on 21-23 January: <http://indico.cern.ch/conferenceDisplay.py?confId=24443>. The meeting focused on checking the progress on the first EGEE-II review recommendations (May 2007), assessing the status of the gLite restructuring plan and preparing the transition to EGEE-III. The agenda was reorganised at the last minute owing to the late arrival of participants due to dense fog at Sofia airport.

Third EGEE User Forum

The third EGEE User Forum will be the highlight of this quarter, and will be held from 11 to 14 February 2008 in Clermont Ferrand, France. This is a fantastic opportunity for all users to meet and exchange their experiences of using the Grid in their scientific field, and to present their results to the wider community. As for the last User Forum, a book of abstracts will be published after this event for presentation at the final review of the project.

Grids for Kids

The Project's Gender Action Team organised another successful event this month, the third "Grids for Kids" day aimed at an audience of children aged 9-13, providing an opportunity to learn about the Grid and to see the Grid environment in action. The children reacted extremely well to the activities, expressing their enthusiasm with myriad questions and ideas.

The Grids for Kids programme can be replicated by EGEE partner institutes with relative ease. The presentations can be translated into local languages, the games are available on-line, and the need for and applications of Grid computing can be illustrated with reference to local institutes. The program could also involve a visit to whatever technical infrastructure is available at the partner institutes.
