



Dear EGEE-II project members,

The 3<sup>rd</sup> User Forum was held last week, on 11-14 February, in Clermont Ferrand, France. 310 participants attended the event, which featured 111 presentations, 19 demos and 37 posters. A mixture of plenaries and parallel sessions completed the event's agenda, and summaries of the parallel sessions were given on the last day covering all the disciplines present and the thematic areas. The External Advisory Committee attended the User Forum, providing their perspective and impressions, as well as voting for the best demonstration. The awards went to:

• Best demonstration prize: "The Health-e-Child (HeC) Gateway and Case Reasoner, a Concrete Implementation and Use-Case of a gLite-based Healthgrid for European Paediatrics"

The presentations, demonstrations and posters shown testify to the wealth and diversity of the applications currently running on the EGEE infrastructure. Looking back over the three annual user forums, the basic question has changed from "if" grids can be used to produce scientific results to "how best" to use the grid to these ends as well as new business models.

The grid communities' thoughts have consequently moved from examining the infrastructure itself to looking at the most appropriate higher-level services and the user forum confirmed that gLite has established itself as a key platform which is capable of supporting such exciting developments. The creation of the RESPECT programme (Recommended External Software for EGEE CommuniTies) is set to be an excellent vehicle for promoting the sharing of such higher-level services between different user communities and future user forums will provide great opportunities for expanding its content and impact.

The transition towards the EGI model was presented in the plenary session and this led to some good suggestions for how the user forum event itself can be part of the transition process.

## Progress of EGEE-III negotiations

The FP7 informatics tools used for collecting all project proposal data encountered numerous problems which caused delays for the negotiation progress. However, the European Commission is confident that the process is moving forward as planned and the start date of EGEE-III will be 1 May 2008. The European commission has also endorsed the EGEE-II project's request for a one month extension.

A transition meeting is scheduled for all participants of the EGEE-III project on 6 and 7 May 2008 at CERN. The Project Office is currently preparing all documentation and webpages to ensure the start of this new FP7 project is as smooth as possible.
