It was a great pleasure to see so many of you in person recently at EGEE'09 in Barcelona – 631 delegates attended, making it the largest event of EGEE-III so far. With 108 sessions, 22 demos and 57 posters, it was a busy and productive week!

A good atmosphere permeated the week – everyone seemed optimistic and ambitious. All the key stakeholders were assembled in one place, including NGIs, the nascent SSCs and users representing a wide range of scientific disciplines. Having representatives from eleven ESFRI projects present was particularly exciting, promising rich interactions between large-scale science projects and e-Infrastructures for the future.

While EGEE'09 was our final project conference, it is not our last event. Come April we'll be heading north for the final User Forum which will be held in collaboration with EGI and the Nordic DataGrid Facility in Uppsala, Sweden, 12-16 April 2010. With the establishment of sustainable European and National e-Infrastructures this event will be the ideal place for European e-Infrastructure users to meet, share experiences, and shape the future of European e-Infrastructures – and say goodbye to EGEE.
