Briefly, a timeline of key events for EGEE in 2010:

Monday, 1 February, Amsterdam: Regional Operations Centre Manager's (SA1) face-to-face meeting

Tuesday, 2 February, Amsterdam: All-Activity meeting (9-16h) to discuss EGEE to EGI transition and follow-up on the EGEE-III first review recommendations.

12-15 April, Uppsala, Sweden: EGEE User Forum

Over 170 abstracts were submitted and following review over 100 oral presentations, and around 30 posters and 20 demonstrations have been accepted. 23-24 June, Amsterdam:

The final EGEE-III review will take place at the end of June, with the dress rehearsal being held at CERN during the week of 14-18 June.

Even with the end of the project, this spring will also be a very busy time for us all with many deliverables in preparation to record the progress and status of the project as it draws to an end. Alongside this ending is a new beginning. EGEE remains committed to ensuring a smooth handover to EGI, and this will be the main focus of all activities during the final months of the project and the dedicated All-Activity meeting in Amsterdam at the start of February.
