

Dear EGEE-III project members,

I trust you are enjoying the long days of summer. In the last letter I mentioned the close of EGEE-II's final review. We now have the **reviewers' report** which has been distributed to the Project and Activity Management Boards. It reiterates the positive verbal feedback received at the review. Page four of the report states, "The review panel concludes that the project has been outstandingly successful, both in its individual activities and in its overall management." We can all be very proud of such warm praise.

All deliverables submitted for the review have been accepted. We also received 35 recommendations from the review committee, which we will follow-up actively during EGEE-III. The report also suggests that EGEE continue exploring the possibility of fusing cloud and grid computing for use in science and business.

The excitement surrounding cloud computing, and its relation to grids, make several sessions of the **EGEE'08 conference**, 22-26 September, especially timely. On the opening day, Monday, the business track will feature a session titled "Outsourcing Applications—Grids and Clouds". On Thursday, as part of the applications track, there will be a session called, "New Paradigms: Clouds, Virtualization and Co." Also, we are delighted to welcome Peter Vosshall, Vice President & Distinguished Engineer at Amazon.com, as one of our keynote speakers. On Wednesday he will deliver the talk "Web Scale Computing: The Power of Infrastructure as a Service". If you have not already registered for the conference, waste no time. It is sure to be a worthwhile week!

EGEE'08 will also host a workshop on **European Grid Initiative** (EGI) where an updated blueprint will be presented based on the feedback received during the summer. The transition from the existing project structure to EGI will be discussed and there will be plenty of opportunity for EGEE members to provide their input.

This month will see the introduction of the **PPT tool** for recording your time worked on the project. Its introduction will highlight any gaps in the execution plans for the activities and manpower allocated by each of the project partners.

Erwin Laure will be leaving CERN to take-up the position of director of PDC-HPC at KTH in Stockholm. As technical director and project deputy director, Erwin has been a key person in EGEE and, while we are all very happy for him in his new exciting high-level position, his departure will be deeply felt here at CERN and in the NA1 activity in particular. The arrangements for finding his replacement have been discussed within the PMB and, for those interested in applying for the position, full details can be found on the EGEE website's job pages, <u>http://eu-egee.org/index.php?id=395</u>.
