

Dear EGEE-III project members,

We are delighted to welcome Steven Newhouse as Enabling Grids for E-sciencE's new technical director. Steven began this month, joining the project at a very exciting time. His experience and expertise will be a great asset as we prepare the transition to the next phase of grids in Europe.

An important deliverable is being produced this month: *Planning the EGI transition* (DNA1.4). Migrating EGEE's current operations to those outlined for the European Grid Initiative requires careful planning. This report outlines the project's status on the planned transition, identifying any issues with the proposed organisation and management and suggesting paths to overcome them.

We have gathered input from all EGEE activities and several collaborating projects and non-European countries. This draft deliverable was discussed at the 6 November meeting of the Project Management Board and is being updated to take into the feedback received Refinement of the transition planning will continue as the composition and scope of EGI is finalised.

EGEE will be present at SuperComputing 2008 in Austin, Texas, US, and ICT 2008 (Information and Communication Technologies) in Lyon, France later this month. SC08 is the premier HPC event of the year and is a good chance to promote the project in an international setting. ICT08 presents Europe's future priorities for research funding in the ICT area and examines crucial issues of public policy for stimulating innovation through ICT development and uptake.

Looking forward to March 2009, it will be a pleasure to see many of you at the 4th EGEE User Forum will take place on 2-6 March 2009 in Catania, Sicily. The event is co-located with OGF25 and OGF-Europe's 2nd international event, and will be hosted by INFN. This combined event will once again strengthen the links between EGEE and the Open Grid Forum, bringing users and standards bodies together to ensure that the future of the Grid is complemented by the establishment of key standards.

The programme committee is accepting abstracts for the event until 5 December.
