### News from the Project

#### EGEE-III Transition

A transition meeting is scheduled for all participants of the EGEE-III project on 6 and 7 May 2008 at CERN. All details for registration to the event and logistics will be made available as soon as possible. The Project Office is currently preparing all documentation and web pages to ensure the start of EGEE III is as smooth as possible.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> EGEE User Forum

The 3rd EGEE User Forum drew to a close after more than 300 people had seen 19 demos, looked at 36 posters, and attended 109 presentations. Plenary sessions on the European Grid Initiative Design Study, planning for the future of the grid infrastructure in Europe; challenges and success of the High Energy Physics Grid; support for applications; current research in Grid Computing; and the SHARE project, developing the Grid for improved healthcare all proved popular. <http://egee-uf3.healthgrid.org/>

The prize for the best demonstration, sponsored by HP, was won by "The Health-e-Child (HeC) Gateway and Case Reasoner, a Concrete Implementation and Use-Case of a gLite-based Healthgrid for European Paediatrics" by David Manset, Director of Biomedical Applications, and Jerome Revillard, Director of Research and Development at maat Gknowledge. Health –e-Child brings together 3 major paediatric medical centres with several European institutions to integrate and exploit biomedical information for improved clinical practice, medical research and personalized healthcare. <http://indico.cern.ch/contributionDisplay.py?contribId=163&sessionId=6&confId=22351>

Of the 36 posters on display, which covered a wide range of topics including much of the science currently being done using the grid, as well as tools, dashboards and methods for making the Grid more accessible, the one chosen by delegates to win the HP Poster Prize was "Fair Grid Scheduling" by Emmanuel Medernach of LPC, France, which looked at ways of efficiently sharing grid resources. <http://indico.cern.ch/contributionDisplay.py?contribId=66&sessionId=49&confId=22351>

### **OGF Europe launches**

On 19 February 2008 the Open Grid Forum announced the creation of OGF-Europe, funded by the European Commission for Mobilising & Integrating Communities on Grid Standards & Best Practices Globally. The OGF-Europe project is aligned with OGF's global mission of pervasive grid adoption through interoperable software standards. ### **The 1st HellasGrid User Forum concluded successfully in Athens**

The 1st HellasGrid User Forum attracted around 100 users from the Greek scientific and education communities that are already using, or are planning to use, the HellasGrid infrastructure. More than 30 Greek scientific teams that used the Grid infrastructure to perform their work presented the results of their activities in various scientific fields, such as seismology, meteorology, physics, computational chemistry, finance, video processing, biomedicine and grid technologies.
